

GENERAL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Bachelor degree (min. 3 years)
- Good oral and written English skills
- Experience with groups of youth in the age group you will be teaching:
 - Elementary: ages 5-12
 - Middle Years: ages 11-14
 - Secondary: ages 12-17
- If applying to the French specialization, a French proficiency test (DELF/DALF)
- Specific academic requirements





FRENCH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

Minimum required DELF/DALF levels:

B1*	Elementary Immersion	Min. score 15 on each part
B1*	Secondary Core French	
C1	Secondary Immersion	





^{*}For Elementary Immersion and Secondary Core French, a B2 or higher DELF is recommended.



Elementary & Middle Years ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

You must present courses in the areas below:

FRENCH	6 credits (literature and composition)	
LAB SCIENCE	3 credits	
MATHEMATICS	3 credits	
CANADIAN HISTORY / GEOGRAPHY	3 credits	
CANADIAN STUDIES	3 credits	
ACADEMIC STUDY	12 credits senior-level coursework	
B1 DELF (B2 or higher DELF recommended)	Minimum score of 15 on each section	

Admission average: Calculated on most recent 60 credits. 65% minimum required for consideration.

Admission average: Calculated on 18-24 credits of upper-level coursework in teachable area. 65% minimum required for consideration.



Secondary (Core French & French Immersion)

You can enter the secondary program with up to two teachable subjects in French:

- Biology
- Chemistry
- Earth Science
- French
- Geography
- History
- Mathematics
- Physics
- Social Science



BC MINISTRY OF EDUCATION FRENCH BURSARY

UBC French BEd teacher candidates are eligible for a federal bursary administered by UBC.

At least 55% of a full-time course load must be taught in French in order to qualify.

The bursary amount depends on allocation guidelines set out by the BC Ministry of Education (usually between \$800 and \$1600).
